CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

B A P T I S M: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

14TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING: ISAIAH 66:10-14C

Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

SECOND READING: GALATIANS 6:14-18

Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to his ideals is what matters most.

GOSPEL: LUKE 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.

"Be still and know that I am God." Psalm 46:10


Annunciation is hosting a one day Centering Prayer Introductory Workshop offered by Contemplative Outreach of Maryland and Washington DC (COMW) on Saturday, September 24, 2016 from 9:00am to 3:00pm. The workshop familiarizes participants with the method of Centering Prayer and its conceptual background and offers two opportunities to experience the prayer. The workshop will be followed by four continuing sessions in several locations in the metro area which will provide support, more background and the time needed to establish a personal Centering Prayer practice.

"Centering Prayer is a receptive method of silent prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of contemplative prayer, prayer in which we experience God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. This method of prayer is both a relationship with God and a discipline to foster that relationship.

"Centering Prayer is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer. Rather, it adds depth of meaning to all prayer and facilitates the movement from more active modes of prayer -- verbal, mental or affective prayer - into a receptive prayer of resting in God. Centering Prayer emphasizes prayer as a personal relationship with God and as a movement beyond conversation with Christ to communion with Christ." Father Thomas Keating O.C.S.O., founder of Contemplative Outreach.

"What does the face of "mercy" look like? If you wanted to paint eyes, ears, nose, and a mouth on it, whose face would we be able to see? For example, each of us can run to his favorite saint. I'll mention St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. She didn't end up with the life she thought was mapped out for her. Widowed at a relatively young age, she entered the Catholic Church and decided to organize a group of women to serve the poor, first of all in the Maryland area, and later in the whole country. Remember that the saints of mercy are not statues, and they're not pictures. They are flesh-andblood people like you and me. SAINT OF THE WEEK



SAINT MARIA GORETTI 1890-1902

Feast-July 6th

St. Maria Goretti was born in Italy in 1890. She was poor and her childhood was difficult. She was virtuous and loved Jesus and Our Lady deeply.

When Maria was eleven years old, a 19 year old neighbor tried to sexually assault her. She resisted, saying it was a sin and God did not want it. He mortally stabbed her 14 times. Maria forgave him. Because of his age, he was spared the death penalty but was sent to prison. He remained unrepentant until St. Maria appeared to him and gave him a lily for each of her wounds. This led to his remarkable conversion. After he was released from prison he spent the rest of his life in a monastery doing penance.

In 1950 Pope Pius XII canonized St. Maria Goretti a saint and martyr. He proclaimed her the Patroness of Modern Youth.

Our Adult Formation programs also need volunteers.


