26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING: AMOS 6:1A, 4-7

Amos denounces the selfish attitude of those who surround themselves with luxuries with no concern for others. He goes on to warn that because these people lacked interest in the state of their society, they would be the first to be exiled.

SECOND READING: 1 TIMOTHY 6:11-16

Paul tells Timothy to seek integrity, faith and love. Paul urges him to attain everlasting life by maintaining strong faith in Jesus and in God until Jesus returns.

GOSPEL: LUKE 16:19-31

Jesus tells of a rich man who feasted daily, while a beggar named Lazarus went hungry outside his gates. When both men died, Lazarus was taken to Abraham, but the rich man was in torment. When he begged for mercy, Abraham reminded him that Lazarus had lived in torment, while the rich man lived in selfish luxury. The man then asked if Lazarus could be sent to his brothers to warn them. But Abraham said if they had not heeded Moses or the prophets, they would ignore even the warning of one risen from the dead.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



SAINT THERESE COUDERC

1805-1885

Feast-September 26th

Born to a French farm family, Marie-Victoire Couderc joined a new religious teaching order, but was sent to manage a mountain hostel for women pilgrims at the shrine of St. John Francis Regis. It became a successful retreat house under her guidance, and the order split into a teaching ministry, the Sisters of St. Regis, and a retreat ministry, the Congregation of Our Lady of the Cenacle. Mother Therese was superior of the Cenacle sisters until 1838, when Jesuit advisers began replacing her with a succession of wealthy women. She lived out her days as an ordinary nun, suffering deafness and painful arthritis at the end. She wrote that "the surrendered soul has found paradise on earth," and was canonized in 1970.

Pope Francis invites us "to become a more effective sign of the Father's action in our lives." We can respond to that invitation by practicing the works of mercy. Look here for food for thought on the works of mercy as we look forward to the upcoming retreat.

Corporal Work of Mercy-Feed the Hungry

Hunger is an ever-present reality of life for many people around the globe. We do not have to travel to Asia, Africa, or South America to find people who do not know where their next meal will come from. Members of 6.9 million households in the US did not have adequate food at times (according to the US Department of Agriculture 2014 study).

What can we do?

- Make it a priority to not waste food; portion out smaller servings and be creative about using leftovers.
- Get involved locally by donating to or volunteering at the local food bank or soup kitchen.
- Support charitable organizations that work toward alleviating hunger by both directly supplying food and helping the poor gain tools, skills, and resources to be able to produce their own food.

Spiritual Work of Mercy-Instruct the Ignorant

Education is often the key that unlocks the prison cell of poverty, whether we talk about mastering reading, writing, and math skills, or about our faith. Spiritual poverty is soul-crushing because it diminishes the religious imagination, which is necessary for living in Christian hope.

For Reflection

In what ways do you instruct other? Our parish offers many opportunities such as volunteering as a catechist or joining in the RCIA process. If teaching is not your personal calling, how might you support the educational opportunities at Annunciation and in our community.
