#### FIRST READING: 2 KINGS 5:14-17

Elisha cures Naaman of leprosy, which convinces Naaman that there is only one God. Naaman then asks to take some loads of soil from Israel, so that he can worship and make sacrifices to one true God on his own land.

#### SECOND READING: 2 TIMOTHY 2:8-13

Paul reminds Timothy that Christ rose from the dead so that many people could be saved. Paul was being treated as a criminal and kept in chains but says. "There is no chaining the word of God!" Paul also says, "if we die in Christ, we will live in him. But if we deny him, he will deny us."

Jesus cures ten lepers, but only one returns to express gratitude for being healed. Jesus is disappointed that only one gave thanks to God, but tells that one, "Your faith has been your salvation."

## **CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS**

**BAPTISM:** The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

**CONFIRMATION:** "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

**RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS:** For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

### THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY: A CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP

#### SATURDAY, OCTOBER 15TH, 10AM-2PM

Pope Francis invites us "to become a more effective sign of the Father's action in our lives." We can respond to that invitation by practicing the works of mercy. Look here for food for thought on the works of mercy as we look forward to the upcoming retreat.

#### Corporal Work of Mercy-Clothe the Naked

Our closets are overflowing; we rent storage units to keep more of the stuff we've acquired. Some estimates state that most of us use only about 20 percent of the clothes in our closet. Much of our clothing is created in developing countries. The textile industry in these countries employs mostly children and women who often work long hours under difficult circumstances.

What can we do?

- Care for our clothes so they may last longer.
- Teach children basic mending skills: how to sew back a button, sew together a seam, or adjust a hem.
- Support local charities by donating clothing in good condition or by shopping there (don't forget business attire).

#### Spiritual Work of Mercy-Counsel the Doubtful

Some people might feel that there is no room for questioning, for turning over a thorny issue of faith, so they walk away, Yet, a mature Christian is one who has wrestled with doubt, who has questioned, and emerged with deeply planted, well-rooted faith as a result. To show mercy is to create space and time to wrestle together but also to reassure and provide advice from our own experience: to lend an ear and to offer insight and care. The most powerful counsel any Christian can give is to bear witness to the joy of the Gospel by sharing God's presence and workings in one's life.



### SAINT OF THE WEEK



#### ST. JOHN XXIII, POPE

1881-1963

#### Feast-October 11th

Born into a farming family in Sotto il Monte in northern Italy in 1881, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was ordained a priest in 1904. With the help of Germany's ambassador to Turkey, Roncalli helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people during World War II. Named a cardinal in 1953, he was elected Pope in 1958 at age 78. He took the name John after his father and the two patrons of Rome's cathedral, St. John Lateran. He convoked (1959) the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). "Good Pope John" died of stomach cancer in June 1963. His feast day recalls the day of the first session of the Second Vatican Council (1962). Declared a Blessed in 2000, he was canonized, together with Pope John Paul II, by Pope Francis in April 2014.
