33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING: MALACHI 3:19-20A

The prophet Malachi warned that the time would come when all the evil people would be punished. He then speaks of the arrival of "the sun of justice, with its healing rays," believed by most to mean Jesus.

SECOND READING: 2 THESSALONIANS 3:7-12

Some of the Thessalonians claimed Christ's return was imminent, so they stopped working and asked others for food. Paul describes his willingness to work, so that he would not impose on others. He encourages them to follow his example and earn their own living.

GOSPEL: LUKE 21:5-19

Jesus warns of the persecution all Christians will face because of him, and how some will even be put to death. Yet he says they will not be harmed because "by patient endurance you will save your lives." If Jesus' followers are loyal, they will be resurrected and their suffering will end.

CELEBRATING THE SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM: The sacrament joyfully celebrates the entrance of members into our Catholic community. Baptisms are celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:45am or by appointment, following preparation of the parents. Baptisms for adults take place through the RCIA process.

CONFIRMATION: "Through the sacrament of confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Confirmation is offered to adults through the RCIA process, and annually for our eighth-grade students. As with the other sacraments of initiation, preparation is involved.

MATRIMONY: Couples should contact the parish office as soon as possible or at least six months in advance of the desired wedding date to make arrangements for preparation.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS: For those who are interested in finding out more information about the Catholic faith and/or interested in becoming Catholic. Please call the parish office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: Our parish continues Christ's ministry of making whole the members of our community who suffer physical or emotional ills with Anointing of the Sick. Please call the parish office if you would like to receive this sacrament.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



ROSE PHILIPPINE DUCHESNE

1769-1852

FEAST November 18

Growing up in a prosperous French family, Philippine joined the Visitation nuns, but returned to her family during the French Revolution. In 1804 she entered the Society of the Sacred Heart. After much preparation, she led a missionary journey to Missouri in 1818. She set up the first free school west of the Mississippi, Sacred Heart houses and Novitiate, and a school for Indians. Despite frontier hardships and ill health, she persevered in her early dream of serving Native Americans.

THE RITE OF ACCEPTANCE & WELCOME



In the Rite there is a change in identity where those previously known as inquirers become catechumens and candidates. The Church will officially welcome the catechumens and candidates as disciples, members (albeit not yet ourschold of faith

fullmembers) of the household of faith.

This rite is the "first consecration by the Church" for those seeking Christian initiation. They will literally be marked with the cross of Christ as God's own.

The Rite of Acceptance/Welcome symbolizes the decision to move forward on a journey as a catechumen (not baptized) or candidate (previously baptized).

The choice to go on marks their "Exodus" from the Stage of Inquiry into a new way of life. This new life will be an answer to God's earlier call to follow Him.

Please pray for our Catechumens and Candidates who are preparing to enter the Catholic Church this coming April. This weekend at the 10:30am Mass, they will be formally accepted and welcomed in to our program. They are:
